FROM THE HEAD OF THE HOLLER By Gary J. Burdette, MMR

Shakespeare once said something about a rose smelling good no matter what you call it. Well, it was something like that as he was referring to the substance of the object rather than the name. Our change from meeting to event may carry similar ramifications in that the title is less important than the components. Yet, in our fast-paced "hip" world a theme, logo, or label can promote interest by stimulating our imaginations and enticing us to visualize what might actually transpire. A fancy moniker must be supported by a solid vision of its vivid portrayal. The "show" must be interesting.

In recent months we have read about a number of events, activities, or experiences that have been designed to promote an interest in model railroading as well as some excitement. In our Coal Division we have had several mini-clinics, M.A.D.D. displays, museum and rail visits, interesting and informative clinics, picnics, train shows, layout tours, and other activities designed to spice up our events. More recently we have enjoyed demonstration and/or hands-on presentations that included ballasting, mountain building, freight car tweaking, animations, tools, and spray painting. In keeping with the monthly themes (like Steel is King) and more free thinking contest subjects (like Photos, Fine Art, and Fantastic Finishes), the substance of the typical clinic has expanded into a more all-inclusive production with photos, plans, how-to, and "stuff" you can actually see and touch (with more-and-more actual manipulation of objects planned).

In June we launched a three-part Event Series titled "Spray Day at the Station." Phase I was "Airbrush Painting" with Bob Weinheimer and Jerry Doyle handling solvent-based paints and Anthony Parrish specializing in water based acrylics. Cardboard paint booths were set up on the old baggage carts outside on the platform. After a primer on airbrushes was held in the waiting room, the group went outside and began painting the MDC box car shells donated by the NMRA to the divisions for just such purposes. Under the guidance of the gentlemen listed above, many nice paint jobs resulted from their efforts. This was a real hands-on learning experience.

Bob had an idea that, since there was no under frame with the shell, an aside could be a scratch-building contest in which the modeler would construct his own floor and bracing. That might be just the spark needed to get the guys to attempt to learn a new skill. No commercial swapping, but sheet, bar, and angled stock. Cut and fit the pieces to make the floor, bracing, levers, and brake rigging. Cast brake parts will be allowed to complete the details. The car will be judged on the under frame only, not the paint job. The contest will be due at the October get-together.

The August Event will be "Picnic on the Platform," and several have volunteered food items. I'll bring burgers along with Bob. Tom signed up for burger buns. Dan will round things out (literally) with hot dogs and buns. Bill will handle the potato salad, with Tony bringing four cases of soda pop. Max (and Rosa) will bring chips and refreshing bottled water. Dave will add some chips, and Larry will bring cookies and water melon. Charles L. promises cookies and Nathan has the cheese and extra-juicy tomatoes from the Racine, Ohio fields. If you have any other ideas or items, let me know.

The "Spray Day" activity will continue with Phase II: Decal Application. Bring the shells you painted in June. If you don't have one, you can still bring an undecorated car either painted or gloss-coated. Tom told us of a screen printing possibility done at a local shop in his home town. Much more will be in the offing with handson attempts at lettering your own car. So, show up, eat, letter, and

RAFFLE Dan Mulhearn



Now that Up The Holler is a monthly publication, your Pike Ad support is much more important. If you don't already have an ad, please consider buying one. We can help with the art work if necessary.








