FROM THE OFFICE DOWN THE HALL

May was my first official meeting as your Assistant Superintendent and I was not there. While my excuse was not division related, it was train related. As previously reported in a Passenger Manifest article, I was on an Amtrak Trek across America. I used the USA RailPass but missed the discounted price deadline in January and paid full price at \$499.00. Still this was a bargain compared to individual tickets for each leg of the trip. In total, I traveled approx. 6000 miles total.

First leg of the trip was from Charleston to Chicago overnight on the Cardinal, train #51. After a 4 hour lay-over, I was then off on train #5, the California Zepher across 6 states, over 52 hours to Sacramento, CA. This of course meant 2 nights sleeping in Coach. Upgrades to Roomette or Bedrooms are not available using RailPass. Even if available, I could not justify the \$1600 and \$2300 respective in additional cost. Besides, sleeping in Coach is like camping out in a tent so I figured I could handle that.

After 2 day and 2 nights in California wine country sleeping in hotels, I was refreshed and ready to board the Coast Starlight #14 at 11:55PM and traveling north overnight to southern Oregon at Klamath Falls. Here again was a 2 night stay in a hotel as I toured Crater Lake National Park and the northern California Redwoods.

Then, re-boarding the Starlight, I was off to Seattle for another overnight rest and shower. Departing late the next afternoon on the Empire Builder #8, we headed north then east across the Cascades of northern Washington & Idaho. Unfortunately we traveled across some most scenic areas of the Pacific Northwest overnight. I awoke to see the western portions of Montana before arriving at 8:00 AM in Whitefish, MT.

There I de-boarded and took a day to visit portions of Glacier National Park that were open. Still plenty of snow on the ground even in early May. Returning to train #8 the next morning, I journeyed across central and eastern Montana at 20 to 40 mph. Strong winds across the plains reduced speed significantly from the normal 79 mph resulting in an 8 hour plus delay arriving back in Chicago. Fortunately, I had built in an overnight lay-over so catching the Cardinal on Saturday for the return to Charleston on #50 was not an issue.

It was a great experience, albeit a little tiring. All in, the trip including hotels and car rentals including the Rail-Pass was approx. \$2100. It was a great way to see the country and as a bonus, you get to ride plenty of trains. Would I do again? yes. I also suggest it is not for everyone. But for those of us with a love of trains, Go for it!!!

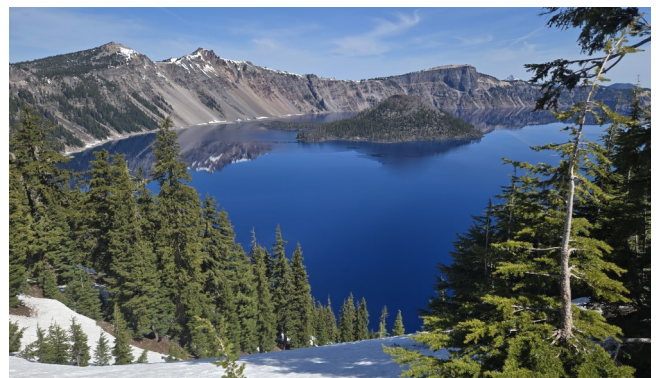

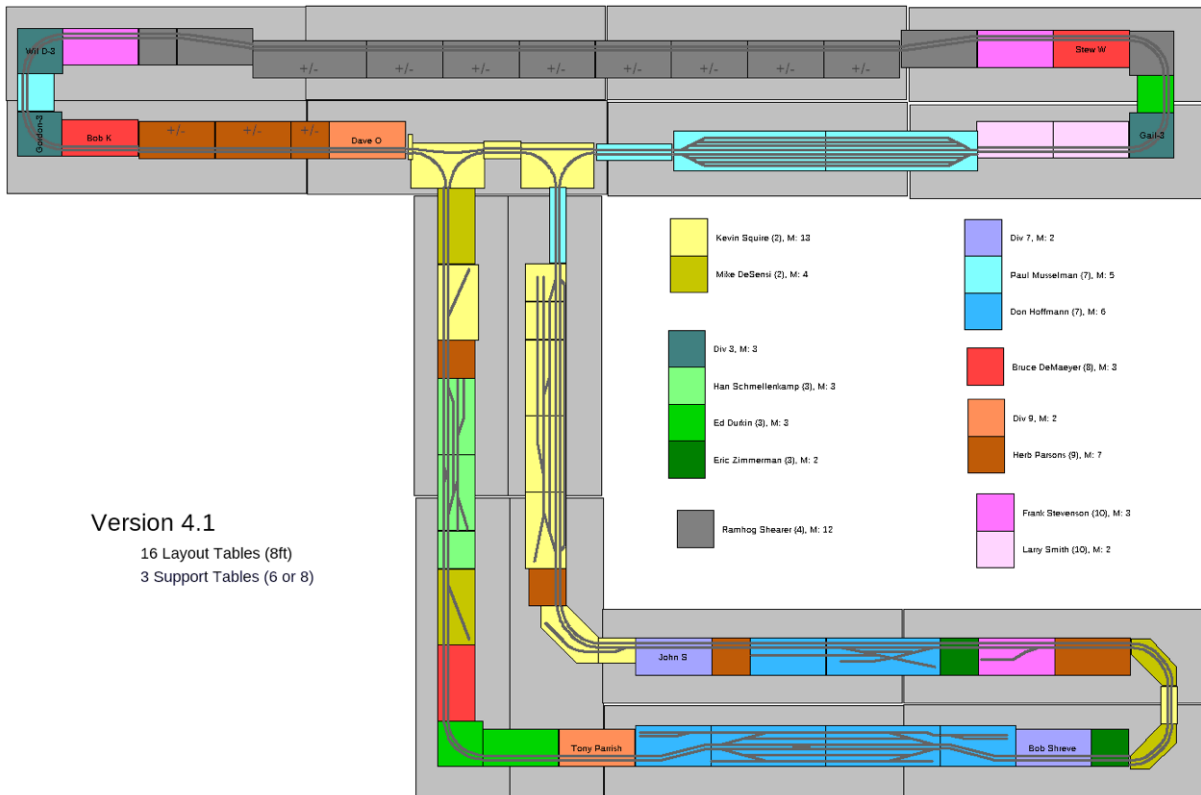
Passenger Manifest Dale Osburn, Membership Chairman


